How much food can actually fit in your fridge/pantry/cabinets? Can you chop up a stir fry on the counter space? Where would the seasonings go? Any wall space to add cabinets?

Smell any odors from the propane or plumbing? What condition is the Heat & AC filters in? Are the CO/Smoke detectors battery operated? Do the vents have fans? What size are they? Battery or hard wired? If you have solar how much power does it provide? Is it Pure sine? How long do recharge? If you have RV hookups how big are the tanks? How do the valves work? Did you check to make sure all vents blow hot or cold air when A/C or Heat are on? Don't want to find a massive mouse nest after purchase do you?

RV trips are usually lengthy road trips. Are the seats comfortable? Do you have cruise control? Radio accessible? How is your vision? Is there a rear view camera? How does the cockpit feel? Can you see yourself driving for 10 hours? 2 days? A week? Month? Few years?

# Crucial Questions to ask before buying an RV while inspecting a used Camper...

Are there signs of previous leaks? If yes, does it look like leaks have been properly repaired? Leaks are the most common and most difficult issue with RVs. If you see an RV with water damage, walk away. It will not be worth the headache as leaks cause rapid deterioration, mold and other structural damage.

Does all the electronics work? Gauges? Water functions?

Have you checked in all the camper cupboards for rodent nests/damage, water damage/mold?

Have you checked all the fluids? Are there any metal shavings from the engine in the fluids?

Do the running lights work? Your RV will not pass inspection if they don't.

Does the awning work properly?

Does the the RV have leveling jacks? Do they work?

How do the tires look? Tread? Miles?Replacing tires—especially on a motorhome— can be costly. If tires need replacing negotiate a better purchase price.

Is the title clear? Do the sellers have maintenance records? Owner's manuals?

When was the last time the RV was driven?Less mileage (specifically on a motorhome) is not always better. RVs quickly deteriorate when left sitting for months.

What animals have lived in the RV, if any? Have any smokers lived in the RV?Allergens and odors can linger for months or years. You may need to get fabrics deep-cleaned in this instance.

Are there any active warranties or any warranties available?

Are there signs of rust?Look closely for rust in the under carriage. This can be a sign of structural damage to the RV. If you're looking for an RV that will last a while, avoid any with rusted framing.
